RECENT COUNCIL ACTION

The Council has approved a resolution creating a mutual aid agreement with most of the Northern Valley municipalities dealing with fire services.

In an effort to better communicate with our citizens, we have approved an agreement with Swift Reach. A safe and secure, portal dedicated for this system, will be on our new website in February where you will be able to update and add your personal information and phone numbers.

Under the direction of Councilwoman Chung, a new and improved Borough website will be launched with all important Borough information and links to various organizations.

Work continues on the preparation of the 2017 budget. You can be assured that every line item will be carefully reviewed in the hope that we can keep our municipal spending under the 2% cap rate. Please remember that approximately 20% of your tax bill is spent on municipal services. The remaining 80% of your tax bill pays for County services and local education costs.

In order to keep municipal expenses down, we are constantly looking at various grants and shared service agreements.

Our pro-active approach to our COAH requirements has resulted in a "temporary immunity from the filing and serving of any Mount Laurel lawsuits, is now extended until April 30, 2017."

WINTER WEATHER TIPS

As the snow season approaches, please consider the following recommendations: When shoveling your driveway, place the snow to the left of your driveway (looking at the driveway from the street). This will eliminate most of the snow being plowed back into the apron area during street cleaning activity. Please do not throw or plow snow back into the street once the road has been cleared. This is a dangerous and illegal activity. Since most of our streets do not have sidewalks or curbs, consider placing reflectors near the curb line to help eliminate the plows from digging up part of your lawn. If this does happen, we will address the problem as the weather permits. Also, if you know of any who may need help during the frigid weather, please be a good neighbor and check on their well-being. Please be safe out there.

ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT Harrington Park has one of the best Fire Departments in all of Bergen County. They are well trained and extremely effective. Their response time is outstanding. The winter months sometimes represent problems that cause delays in the delivery of service. Following a heavy snow, consider removing the snow from around a hydrant located on or near your property. If our firemen need to shovel out the area, they lose valuable time that could result in the serious loss of life and property. Please consider helping our volunteer fire fighters better serve the community.


Badges are required for private and group lessons for both instructor and student.




