RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale of any residential use will require the owner to apply and secure a **Certificate of Continued Occupancy** from the **HP Building Department**. *This inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/Carbon Monoxide Certificate also filed through the Building Department.*

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

Please change the batteries in your smoke/carbon monoxide detectors every six(6) months. When the batteries go dead, the detectors do not work. Remember the life span of any detector, electric or battery is ten years. If yours is that old, replace them. They may not work when you need them to work. When in doubt, **REPLACE THEM**, the life you save may be that of you or a family member.

REMEMBER,

If a fire should occur, exit your home immediately, meet at a predetermined location in front of your home, call 911 and **DO NOT GO BACK IN. GET OUT AND STAY OUT.** Give the responding Officers and Fire Fighters the locations of any missing family members. Harrington Park has a extremely quick response time.

Please, with the warm weather approaching, **DO NOT STORE GASOLINE or GASOLINE POWERED MOWERS, SNOW BLOWERS, TRIMMERS OR SAWS IN YOUR HOME. Keep them outside.** THE GASOLINE FUMES CAN IGNITE AND CAUSE **SERIOUS DAMAGE TO YOUR HOME.**



FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK ...

AS THE SEASONS CHANGE

I am sure we are all looking forward to the start of Spring, Monday, March 20th. As the weather improves, please remember that there will be an increase in the number of our children involved in athletic activities at our school, recreation sites and in our streets.

I ask that you review with your children safety procedures associated with their activities. I also ask you to pay special attention to your driving habits. Most of our streets have speed limits of 25 miles per hour. So please, slow down and drive as though your children live on the street you are driving on.

2017 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

On Monday, March 13, 2017, the Council introduced the municipal portion of this year's budget. As you are well aware, our portion of your tax bill is approximately 20% of the total you pay. The remainder goes to pay for education (70%) and County services (10%).

Using the average home assessment of just over \$539,000, there will be a yearly increase of \$70.00 or \$5.83 (rounded) per month. We were able to remain under the "cap rate" imposed by the State. Our increase is 1.91%. Our surplus balance will be just under \$888,882, since we are using \$368,000 in this year's budget.

The public hearing on the budget will take place on Monday, April 10, 2017 at 7:00pm in the Council Chambers. I want to thank Councilman Pedersen, Chairman of the Finance Committee, as well as the entire committee, for the time and effort that went into the preparation of the Budget. They were assisted and supported by the Borough's CFO, Mr. Kunjesh Trivedi, who carefully monitors our financial situation.

POLICE OFFICER JAMES LAVIGNA HONORED

At our Council Meeting, on February 27, 2017, Harrington Park Police Officer LaVigna was honored with a Life Saving Award, as well as, a County Certificate of Commendation for his "Heroic Actions" on December 21, 2017.

Officer LaVigna responded to a 911 call, and took actions that helped save the life of one of our young residents who was unable to breathe. After the administration of oxygen, LaVigna rushed the family to HUMC in Westwood. Hospital officials, according to Chief Maalouf, credited LaVigna's actions as a truly lifesaving effort.

Mrs. Nora Fregenti, mother of the child stated, "I'm so grateful that he was there and at the right time. It was a Godsend." This experience is but one example of how our police department exists to "serve and protect." Thank you, Officer LaVigna for your service to the Borough of Harrington Park.

WHAT THE HECK HAPPENED?

We are all familiar with the terms or phrases, "The Perfect Storm" and "if something can go wrong, it will." That was what our seven person DPW had to deal with as a result of the March 14 winter storm.

Once our crew was called out on Tuesday morning, the eleven (11) County roads were given priority. Interior roads are next on the list. This is where the problems started. I have been asked several questions which also may concern you.

Based on the intensity of the storm and the changing weather conditions (snow to sleet), matters went sour. We suffered mechanical breakdowns with our equipment, most of which were taken care of in house. We completely lost one of our sanders/salters. In addition, some homeowners, once it was daylight, moved their cars from their driveways, into the streets. This action slowed the plowing down. Some cleared their cars of snow, as well as their driveways, and left the snow in the street. As the temperature dropped, everything froze over.

By law, our DPW staff is limited as to the number of consecutive hours they can work. Rest periods are required for the safety and protection of everyone. Whether you saw or heard our trucks, our staff was out there working for you.

We do not have a substitute staff, or an inventory of equipment, to meet every emergency. The cost of some of our equipment runs into the \$200,000 to \$250,000 range and above. While we have "shared service" agreements with many of the Northern Valley neighbors, they were all faced with similar demands.

From the Mayor's Desk continued...

We have been well served by our DPW in the past. This unique situation will be resolved. Meetings have been scheduled to address this issue. Be assured that we will attempt to resolve this problem. As usual, I thank you for your understanding and patience. It was not our intention to allow nature to resolve our problem. On this one occasion, there were problems we had limited control over.






