

RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale of any residential use will require the owner to apply and secure a **Certificate of Continued Occupancy** from the **HP Building Department**. *This inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/Carbon Monoxide Certificate also filed through the Building Department.*

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

It is that time of year that you should do the following to make you home and business safe.

1. Test all Carbon Monoxide detectors and smoke detectors.
2. Change all of the batteries in these detectors.
3. Inspect all of your Holiday Decorations to make sure there are no broken wires. Replace them now before you use them.
4. **AT NO TIME SHOULD GASOLINE OR OTHER FLAMMABLE PRODUCTS BE KEPT IN YOUR HOME.** This includes Gasoline, gasoline -oil mixtures including those in one quart cans with the screw top, kerosene, and torch fuel.
5. Any power mowers stored in your basement shall be drained of all fuel and let to air dry before bring them inside.
6. All snow blowers are to be kept outside.
7. **NO PROPANE IS TO BE STORED IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS.**
8. **KEEP PORTABLE GENERATORS OUTSIDE AND AWAY FROM ANY OPEN WINDOWS AND DOORS.** Even with the windows closed, Carbon Monoxide can seep into your home.
9. Have a service professional inspect your boiler, furnace and hot water heater. Repair them now before you need them.
10. Talk to your neighbors, and decide who will shovel out the hydrant near your property when it snows. Remember that hydrant will be used for any fire in your neighborhood.
11. Check on the elderly in your neighborhood. Sometimes they will need help but are too proud to ask.
12. Be a good neighbor, watch out for everyone, and make sure everyone is ok. If you see a buildup of papers in the driveway say something to the Police. Let them investigate.
13. If you choose to use any live Holiday Decorations inside your home, Keep them watered and at the first sign of dryness, remove them. Dried decorations are very dangerous. See you tube Christmas tree fires.

SPECIAL NOTICE: Effective September 3, 2017, All business, stores, Churches and Schools will be required to have installed Carbon Monoxide Detectors as per the New Jersey Uniform Fire code, subchapter 4. Minimum requirements, Battery Operated or Plug in type.

FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK ...

PSEG ROADWORK UPDATE

As I write this article, the milling and re-paving of all the roads affected by the upgrading of gas service is underway. The last several months have been a difficult and frustrating experience for all of us. I again thank you for your patience and understanding.

The good news related to this project is the Borough of Harrington Park will be saving in excess of \$1,020,000.00 for the re-paving of the streets disturbed during this work. In 1995, I asked Council to approve an ordinance that required curb to curb re-paving whenever the roadway is disturbed to this extent. This \$1,020,000.00 savings translates into over an 11 point tax savings for our residents.

ADDITIONAL UTILITY WORK

The tree trimming and cutting along our roadways will result in better electrical and cell phone service in various sections of town. Orange and Rockland will be installing new poles to achieve this goal. Hopefully, this work will be completed in a timely fashion.

TOWN DAY - FUN FOR ALL

This year the Annual Town Day will be held on Saturday, September 9, 2017 (noon-4pm) with a rain date of September 10, 2017 (1pm-4pm). NEW GRANT FOR HP

The Borough has been notified that we are the recipient of a New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant for 2017 to re-pave Glen Avenue East. The amount received will be \$165,627.00. Neglia Engineering will design the paving project to begin at HP School area on Lynn Street and move easterly on Glen Avenue East towards Kline Street. The project will go out to bid by the end of the year with paving to start in the Spring 2018.

THE LATEST COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

The Annual Audit has been completed and once again under the direction of Mr. Gary Higgins, Borough Auditor all went very smoothly. I thank Mr. Trivedi, Borough CFO, for his diligent work with the Finance Committee and his financial guidance to Council all year long.

Approved Ordinances:

#710 Amending the Mechanical Fees for the Building Department

#711 Amendment to the Master Plan dealing with the development and redevelopment in the I-1 Zoning District.

#712 Amendment to the Feeding of Wildlife to now prohibit Feeding of Wildlife on private property, but shall not apply with respect to private property, the feeding of birds by way of a "bird feeder".

Council approved a resolution to continue the municipal participation with Community Development for the next three years. Councilwoman Joon Chung is the municipal liaison for this program which provides funding for the senior van services that we share with Haworth, and funding for senior trips that are run through Club 60.


