

RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale of any residential use will require the owner to apply and secure a **Certificate of Continued Occupancy** from the **HP Building Department**. *This inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/Carbon Monoxide Certificate also filed through the Building Department.*

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

FIRE PREVENTION:

Please inspect all holiday lights and discard any that look **BAD**. Please water daily all Christmas trees that you are using indoors. At the first sign of drying out, remove them immediately. Dry trees contribute to a very high fire load. For more information, please go to youtube-Christmas tree fires.

Always remember to change the batteries in your Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors. If they depend on battery power and the battery is dead or missing, **THEY WILL NOT WORK**.

If you have 110volt interconnected detectors with battery back up, those batteries must be changed also. In the event of a power failure, the batteries keep your detectors working properly.

Please take the time to inspect them now.

FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK ...

GRANTS AND/OR ROAD REPAIRS

Since the last publication of the newsletter, the Borough has received a \$223,200.00 grant for SCBA; spare cylinders and face masks for our Volunteer Fire Department.

I was also pleased to learn that we will be receiving \$4,000 for our Senior Van operation and \$3,500 for Senior Activities from the Bergen County Community Development program.

In addition, we have applied for a grant of \$542,208.00 to help pay for road improvements next year. Also, we plan on working with the Riverside Cooperative to secure the greatest benefit on road improvement costs.

THE ALLEGRO GROUP GETS FINAL APPROVAL

At the Planning Board meeting on October 3, 2017, the Allegro Group was granted final approval to develop the former corporate sight of the Suez Water property on Old Hook Road.

The anticipated startup of construction should be in May or June of 2018. The facility will provide rental units for people 55 or older, as well as, assisted living and memory care units. Plans call for a total of 177 units. It is estimated that it will take 18-24 months for the complex to open. The Borough is not involved in any way regarding applications for rental units; however, plans are available to be reviewed in the Clerk's office.

In each case, the Borough of Harrington Park and the surrounding areas have benefited from their efforts. In addition to receiving a Proclamation, all four Scouts were honored with having a special day named after them as part of the Borough's History.

HELP HP STAY CLEAN AND GREEN

Our Environmental Commission reminds us that we can serve both our community and our economy by separating regular garbage and recyclable materials.
