



DOG LICENSE - Due by Jan.31 - Late fees begin Feb.1 \$10 late fee per dog

CAT LICENSE - Register your cat by completing an application for a 2019 Cat License. The fee is \$10 per cat. Please include proof of rabies vaccination, good through October 2019. A late fee is assessed for applications received after April 15, 2019.



CHICKEN LICENSE - Apply for, or Renew your license by completing an application for a 2019 Chicken Permit. The annual fee is \$20.



Senior Van

Since March 2001, we entered into an Interlocal Agreement with Haworth & Closter(2017)

Van available to senior citizens **Monday through Friday.**

Seniors just need to call 385-3577 and leave a message with the following information:

1. Date and time that you would like to make use of the van
2. Location that the driver should pick you up (from)
3. Destination that you want to get to
4. Approx. length of visit/When you would like the driver to return to bring you home.

You will always get an answering machine, but all messages are picked up daily, Monday thru Friday between 6 and 9 p.m.

You need to give at least 3 days notice, but you can book something (i.e. trip for a doctor's appointment) as much as 2-3 months in advance!

Doctor appointments will always take priority over shopping or other trips for pleasure. The coordinator/driver will call you back to confirm your reservation. In the case of plans made months in advance, and will also call you the night before to re-confirm arrangements.

RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale of any residential use will require the owner to apply and secure a **Certificate of Continued Occupancy** from the **HP Building Department**. *This inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/Carbon Monoxide Certificate also filed through the Building Department.*

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

Effective January 1, 2019 **FOR RESIDENTIAL USE**, all smoke detectors and Carbon Monoxide detectors shall be the type that contain a 10 year battery. This applies to the hard wired type 110 volt and battery operated types. The effective life of the detectors shall be 10 years. Please check your existing detectors for their manufactured date and if it is more than 10 years old, they shall be replaced with the 10 year battery type .

The Fire Extinguisher shall be of the 2ABC 10 pound size.

Business Owners: All Businesses that have a fuel burning appliance in their building, a carbon monoxide detector battery powered is required. If you have a fire alarm system, the detector shall be part of that system.



REMEMBERING A HARRINGTON PARK HERO

Randall Mark Carlton was born on May 1, 1950. He attended the Harrington Park School District and high school at Northern Valley Old Tappan. While still in his secondary education, Randy made the selfless decision to enlist in the US Marines. He did so on June 17, 1968 and was deployed to Vietnam, arriving on December 6, 1968 as a member of Company A, 9th Marines, 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Division.

In a valiant effort against stiff enemy opposition, Randy lost his life in the Trieu Phong District of Quang Tri Province in the Da Krang River Valley in Vietnam near the border of Laos. He was laid to rest with full military honors for his heroism in Westwood Cemetery and has since been joined by his adoring parents.

Although Randy was best known for his spirited and adventurous dynamic, he was an exceptionally talented artist and vocalist, in addition to his dedication and obvious love of our country.

Randall Carlton list his life on February 21, 1969. On the fiftieth anniversary of his death, we remember the sacrifice so many paid in defense of our great nation. As you know, we honor all of our Harrington Park residents who lost their lives during military conflicts as part of our Memorial Services each year.

HARRINGTON PARK ROAD REPAIRS IN 2019

Over the course of the years, we have been repairing the roads in Harrington Park. For those who would like to know what roads have already been addressed, please see the map Borough Hall that illustrates our past accomplishments.

In 2019, we will be working with the Riverside Co-operation, the New Jersey Department of Transportation and the Federal Government Grant Program. In addition, pot holes are being filled daily whenever the streets are free of snow.

All of the agencies mentioned above help reduce the cost of re-paving our streets if we qualify. We also have the option of passing a bond ordinance to pay for needed repairs.

Please be assured that road repairs are on the front burner in terms of our priorities.

UPDATE ON THE ALLEGRO PROJECT

At our last meeting with members of the Allegro team, we were told that demolition of the existing building on the SUEZ Water Company property will begin shortly after the first of the year. Following the removal of the structure, construction of the new facility will take between 18-24 months.

The new building will provide space for three forms of housing. There will be market rental units for residents 55 years or older. In addition, assisted living units will be available, along with memory loss units.

Based on the presentations made at our Planning Board meeting, the units will be top quality with outstanding amenities. I will keep the public informed as to the progress being made.

The issue of solid waste disposal is a universal problem. All of us can be part of the solution in a small way by expanding the efforts to recycle. The single stream recycling system that our town provides makes it easy to do this. Simply separate paper, glass, and plastic from garbage and place it at the curb for pick up every Thursday. Right now, recycled materials average about 30% of the waste; the goal is to reach 50%. An even better solution is to take your cardboard, glass and aluminum directly to the DPW recycling center; the proceeds from the sale of these materials goes directly to the town rather than to the hauler, and saves the town money by decreasing the weight of the collected materials.

There are many ways we can keep our town beautiful and healthy for everyone: for example, participate in clean-up events, pick up after your pets, put litter in proper receptacles and abide by vehicle idling statutes when waiting in your car.

Many new members joined, some crucial sprucing up was done to the buildings, the pool and grounds never looked better, and the club finished the year in a sound financial position. 




