FIRE PREVENTION

During the pandemic, use this simplified system for inspecting Smoke Alarms/Carbon Monoxide Detectors/Fire Extinguishers for the sale of a home. Obtain the Application and Certificate; submit the complete form with the application and fee; the Inspection certificate will be issued. After the Pandemic, I will inspect for correct installation. Do not store gasoline inside your home. Keep all grills away from your house. Fire pits must be installed in your yard and not on your deck. Call 911 at the first sign of a fire. Get out and stay out. If you are going to celebrate the 4th of July, use sparklers, snakes, snappers or party poppers. Roman candles, bottle and sky rockets, fire crackers, and all noisemaking fireworks are illegal. Please be safe and enjoy the summer.

A large, fixed amount of money is required to open and close the pool and state law mandates at least three lifeguards be on duty every moment we're open, so labor costs are relatively fixed, no matter how many people are there. We know many would welcome a summer at the pool, and this temporary closure is a loss to all of us, but we can look forward to 2021 with no deleterious effects to our facilities.

WORSHIP SCHEDULES

Residential Certificate of Continued Occupancy Required

Any rental, lease, or sale for any residential use will require the owner to apply for and secure a Certificate of Continued Occupancy from the Building Department. The resulting inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/ Carbon Monoxide Certificate, also filed through the Building Department.

The Environmental Commission Corner

We are fortunate to live in a community with yards and gardens and are able to enjoy the outdoors, while maintaining our social distance. It is a good time to assess those gardens and embark on some improvement projects that encourage good environmental practices. Start with lawns that cover a significant part of your home landscaping. Use good seed mixes like a **tall fescue mix**. The goal is to eliminate weed killers and use less water and fertilizer. Consider growing a vegetable garden. Of course, there are the deer! If you don't want to fence, you can grow many varieties of vegetables in pots on porches and decks. Tomatoes, salad greens, peppers, even potatoes can be grown in pots. You need to provide several hours of sun, water, and fertilizer. Organic fertilizer is available. Garden centers can supply seeds, starter kits, and plants. Seeds and small plants can also be ordered online. If you are thinking about landscaping renovation, consider native plants, which thrive better than imported ornamental plants because they require less water and fertilizer. They are important pollinators and hosts for native insects and birds, providing the ecological balance needed to maintain our food supply. Check out the Native Plant Society of New Jersey www.npsnj.org. Garden responsibly; wear masks outside; stay healthy and safe.

The Ciccoricco sons have set up a non-profit foundation, a named scholarship, and a lecture series in honor of their parents, longtime residents and esteemed educators Holly and Edward Ciccoricco, to help early career teachers become inspired educators. Still a prolific artist, Holly taught art and computer education at the Alpine Public School, was Art Director for the Northern Valley Summer Camp, and was on the faculty of the Art School in Demarest, where she also taught special education. Edward founded and co-directed Pre-school Instruction for the Exceptional (PIE) for pre-school children with special needs. He helped establish and co-direct the Valley Program for children on the autism spectrum and served as regional Director of Curriculum and Instruction for the NVRHS and its 7 sending districts. Garden Club of Harrington Park



NJMVC Further Extends Driver License, Registration, and Inspection Expiration Dates Due to COVID-19

TRENTON – Governor Phil Murphy and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Chief Administrator Sue Fulton announced additional extensions to driver license, registration, and inspection expiration dates in their continuing efforts to mitigate COVID-19 and safeguard public health.

Effective immediately, the following documents, if expiring between March 13 and May 31, have been extended to July 31. Documents expiring June 30 are extended two months to August 31, and those expiring July 31 are extended to September 30.

- All Standard driver licenses (including permits) and standard non-driver IDs
- Privately owned and commercial vehicle registrations
- Vehicle inspections
- Purple Heart/Disabled Veteran placards
- Temporary tags



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
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
