FIRE PREVENTION NEWS

All of your live holiday decorations including trees and wreaths should now be removed, as Christmas tree fires occur when they are left displayed, not being watered, with lights turned on. It is time to change the batteries in your smoke alarms. Daylight savings time starts on March 8th: the perfect time to change the batteries. Please get into the habit of changing them when we change our clocks, sooner if they start to chirp, a warning that the batteries need to be changed. If you are changing a battery powered smoke alarm, you must by law buy one with a 10-year battery. Do it right and avoid the aggravation of having a failed inspection when you want to sell your home. Spring time will be here soon, do not store your snow blower in your home with gasoline in the tank; for that matter, never store gasoline inside your home. The Environmental Commission Corner

From Eagles to Songbirds in and around Harrington Park March 11 at 7:00 pm at the Library with Barry Higgins, wildlife photographer, naturalist, and HP resident. From September through early November Barry participates in the State Line Hawk Watch at the Palisades Interstate Park. He is one of many volunteers who observe overhead the raptor migration through our region, watching, counting and photographing falcons, hawks, and eagles as they migrate to their winter grounds. When not counting raptors, he enjoys observing and photographing all species of birds both local and statewide. From the large and powerful to the small and beautiful, learn how you can become involved and share the enjoyment of our winged creatures of the Earth. He will present a slide show of our local feathered friends and audio of some of their calls. Barry will also share great local viewing areas and tips on taking the best photos.



Plastics Ban In September the Mayor and Council passed a borough-wide ordinance banning the commercial use of single-use plastic bags, straws and stirrers, and polystyrene foam. This ordinance, proposed by the Environmental Commission, went into effect in January.

Shredding Event and Mulch Sale On April 18 the Shred truck will be at the Borough Hall parking lot from 9:00 to 12:00. Bring receipts, bank statements, etc., for secure disposal by shredding. On the same day you can order compost to be delivered to your yard in early May. The cost is \$10 per cubic yard (minimum 2 yards). It's never too early to think about our gardens.
