RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale of any residential use will require the owner to apply and secure a **Certificate of Continued Occupancy** from the **HP Building Department**. *This inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/Carbon Monoxide Certificate also filed through the Building Department.*

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

*Happy Holidays to all from the Fire Prevention Bureau of the
Harrington Park Volunteer Fire Department*

Please make sure of the following:

- Check all smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms to make sure they work. Change the batteries.
- Check all holiday lights both inside and out. Replace those that are worn or broken. These can cause a fire.
- Do not over use extension cords.
- Do not overuse power strips. NEVER plug one power strip into another. That will cause a fire!
- If you use live holiday decorations (Christmas tree), check the water level daily. At the 1st sign of the tree drying out DISCARD it immediately. A dry Christmas tree is the number one cause of home fires at this time of the year.
- Have a professional come and check your heating system to make sure your chimney is not blocked and that it works correctly.
- If you use outside burning pits, Please make sure they are away from all combustible items, your house and trees.

Home Fire Safety begins with you the homeowner. Please practice exit drills from your home and establish a meeting place so that you can account for all members of your family in the event of a fire.



WINTER WEATHER TIPS

As the winter weather approaches, consider staking out your property border with reflectors to help the snowplow drivers know where your lawn is located. If you have a fire hydrant on your property, please keep it accessible at all times. Make sure all the snow is cleared for our Volunteer Fire Department and first responders in case of an emergency.


