## WHO OWNS "The Woods"?

### Important Information for Parents

The town owns a small tract of land known as Beechwood Park (accessed from Beechwood Pl.). This land contains the largest known stand of American Beech trees in New Jersey. South of Beechwood Park, there is a tract of land, which the Borough currently leases from United Water. Most of the large tracts of woodlands in town are owned by United Water.

A walk through these woods reveals that the land has been abused. Garbage, soda, beer, liquor bottles and cans are thrown about. Pathways have been disturbed and trees have been cut down and massive dirt bike jumps have been constructed. All this creates a unique set of problems and dangers.

These lands are part of our watershed, which means runoff from these lands feeds our drinking supply reservoir. These lands protect water quality and preserve open space and are subject to NJ State Environmental regulations that are particularly stringent regarding land-use. UW is charged by the state to see that the environmental regulations are followed. UW has the power to issue complaints against those who misuse this sensitive property and the Borough Police Department is authorized to enforce local and state ordinances on these lands. Trespassing and vandalism can result in serious consequences. In addition, in case of a serious accident (e.g. on a bike jump) the Police and Ambulance Corps have alerted us to the difficulty in removing an injured person from the woods.



We want to preserve this beautiful land as part of our unique heritage in town. Help to keep these woodlands healthy and picturesque. Please discuss this with your children and sensitize them in maintaining the beauty of these woods and at the same time, stay out of trouble.

For 20 years, (1988-2008), St. Andrew's Church, in association with the Interreligious Fellowship for the Homeless of Bergen County, has been providing food and shelter for those in need. In addition to providing shelter for the homeless, our volunteers also take part in the Walk-in Dinner Program. This program provides dinners each day of the year at the Orchard Street facility in Hackensack. Some of our volunteers also host the residents of the Family Shelter for an entire week.

Special recognition was given to Mr. Paul Shackford and his committee for their hard work during the past 20 years. Paul was a major force in getting the St. Andrew's program started. At the Harrington Park shelter alone, nearly 4000 adult men and women have found "a safe place to sleep, food for nourishment, and fellowship".

### **NEW OPEN SPACE GRANT**

The expansion has provided more activities for people of all ages.

### **C.O.A.H. UPDATE**

As you may already know, the Council on Affordable Housing has mandated that the Borough of Harrington Park is required to provide 41 units under their third round requirements.

We are working to meet the Dec. 31, 2008 deadline for the submission of our plan and related documents. Meetings of and between, the Borough Council and our Planning Board, will take place in the near future.

In addition, we are challenging the number of units assigned to the Borough. We have joined the New Jersey League of Municipalities lawsuit and are considering other legal moves to protect our interests.

### **E.R. TO RE-OPEN ON OCTOBER 1, 2008**

Agreements have been reached to reopen the Emergency Room at the former Pascack Valley Hospital. The medical site will be run by the Hackensack University Medical Center as a satellite emergency department. The site will be fully staffed and equipped to handle emergency medical needs, but there will be no overnight beds at this time. Patients who need additional care will be transported to the Hackensack facility.

The reopening of the facility will take a great deal of pressure off the emergency service groups who respond to the needs of our residents.

Related to this matter, the HP Council has approved a resolution supporting the hospital's application for a certificate of need. This would allow for the reopening of the whole facility within 18-24 months once approval is obtained by the State.

If you are interested in supporting this effort, petitions are available at various locations in HP. This includes the Clerk's Office in Borough Hall and the Library.
