From the Mayor's Desk....

CSX Train Traffic Review

Based on my concerns over what is being transferred through the Borough of Harrington Park, (number of trains, speed and length), I have organized a meeting to discuss this issue. Harrington Park will be hosting a meeting on May 29th at the Borough Hall for all the Northern Valley Mayors, their Chiefs of Police and Emergency Management Coordinators.

The main purpose of this meeting is to discuss the procedures to deal with various types of situations that involve the safety of our residents. CSX has been very cooperative with our request. A representative from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection will also be attending.

I will keep you informed as to the outcome of our meeting. The safety and security of our residents is a paramount interest of mine and a meeting such as this will go a long way to insure both.

Property Tax Reform....MAYBE?

One of the best attended panel sessions at the New Jersey Conference of Mayors Convention addressed the need for **real** property tax reform. The convention, which I attended, took place from April 30 through May 2, 2014.

While the 2% cap on municipal spending has helped control taxes, it does not address the true cause of the problem.

New Jersey is still using property tax to fund education. It is probably the only state in the union that still functions in this manner. The use of a broad base tax would reduce the burden of property taxation on all residents, but especially those on fixed incomes.

I was impressed with the strong support given by Assembly Majority Leader Louis Greenwald who was part of the panel. As a member of the Board of Directors of the NJCM from Bergen County, I have offered my support and time in the promotion of property tax reform efforts.

I am sure you realize that only about twenty cents of every property tax dollar is earmarked to pay for your current municipal services. Real reform might help keep more of our residents in Harrington Park.

Lightning Detection in Harrington Park

A Lightning Detection System has been installed in our parks and school fields consisting of horns and strobe lights, covering an area that is roughly 700 yards.

When lightning up to 10 miles away is detected, the signals will be activated. The detector, located centrally in Norwood, will send a signal to remote devices located in all participating Northern Section municipalities. The three fields outfitted with the emergency notification devices are the Harrington Park School, Highland Field and Pondside Park.

When first activated, residents will hear three blasts of the siren and a strobe light will flash and continue to flash until no lightning is detected for 30 minutes. The "all clear" signal to notify residents that it is safe to return to the fields or parks is one siren blast and the deactivation of the strobe lights. Until hearing the "all clear" signal, residents must go to their vehicles or a permanent structure for shelter.

HP Received a \$149,000 Grant

I am pleased to inform you that the Borough has received a \$149,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation. The grant will be used to repair and pave Lynn Street from Harriot Avenue north in the direction of Pine Place.

Other road repairs are planned for the area around Don Horsey Park and Harriot Place from George Street to where it intersects with Harriot Avenue near Thomas Street.

We are also working with the Riverside Cooperative to develop a serious plan to address other roadways throughout the Borough. Since our debt service is nearly eliminated, we are considering a new bond ordinance to fund several well needed projects and municipal equipment.

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
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
