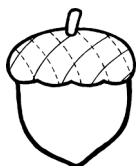

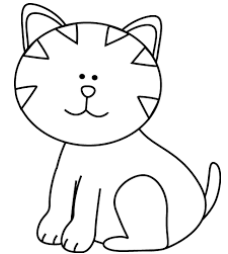

Our Members will again monitor runners at various course locations
during the Harrington Park 5K Fall Spectacular on November 2nd.

On October 7th, second graders received a first hand explanation
of the ambulance and some of the equipment used during medical
emergencies.

We will also provide coverage at 3 NVOT Varsity & JV football games.
During September, the Members responded to 27 medical emergencies,
186 so far in 2019.

Our Members also are required to complete courses and training as a
prerequisite to the recertification process every three years.

We are committed to supporting Harrington Park resident emergencies
and to provide assistance when requested to our neighboring towns.

Message from the Fire Marshal Thomas E. Simpson

The bureau of fire prevention reminds all residents that they should check all of the holiday lighting that they will be installing both inside and out. Please discard all sets of lights that show any wear as this wear can lead to a fire. Please make sure that the lights that you purchase are a listed product with a recognized testing laboratories such as Underwriters laboratories. There have been instances where lights purchased in the dollar stores are not listed.



If you are going to have a fresh cut Christmas tree in your home, please make sure you water it daily and remove it as soon as it shows signs of drying out. YouTube video has numerous videos of Christmas tree fires. I suggest that you look at one and see the devastation caused by a tree fire. Remember, do not run extension cords under carpet. This is the number one cause of residential fires as the cord gets destroyed by walking over it and always use the appropriate size cord for the use.

Finally, make sure all of your detectors are working and if they need replacing, replace them. If they are battery operated, NJ State Law requires the use of detectors with a ten year battery.

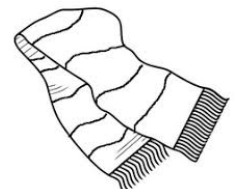
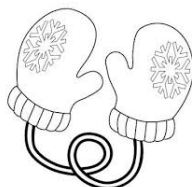
If fire strikes, Get out and stay out. Close all doors behind you.

(Preschool – Age 5)

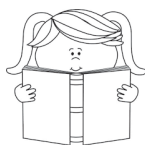

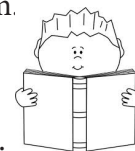

FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK ...

MEMORIAL PARK BENCH FUND RAISER

Currently, I am gathering information regarding a town wide fundraiser earmarked for our Beautification Program in town.

Simply stated, a resident would be able to purchase a bench in the memory of a loved one, have it personalized and placed in an appropriate part of town, including our new pergola. Each bench will provide an everlasting memory of the person you plan to honor.

While I'm gathering more information, I want all of you to know, in advance, what I'm considering. Please check our H.P. website as time allows.

INCREASING NIGHTTIME COVERAGE

In an effort to provide more security and keep our community safer, we are increasing the number of police officers on the 7:00PM to 7:00AM shift. While we do not have a serious crime problem, it is considered a better policy to increase police presence during this time period. This change in coverage should not require additional police officers.

My first priority, is and will remain, the safety and security of our residents and their private and personal belongings.

NEW GENERATOR AT BOROUGH HALL

The Borough of Harrington Park has secured a generator, at no cost to our residents. As a result, during future storms, when we lose power, business at Borough Hall can continue uninterrupted. We also intend to open our doors to those who need to warm up or simply recharge their cell phones.

As you already know, we have an Emergency Management Plan in place that will assist our residents cope with what ever problems occur. I want to suggest that every household considers preparing, in advance, for an interruption of service.

I also ask you to help your neighbors who are older and may be in need of support and assistance.

BEAUTIFICATION PROJECTS CONTINUE

You probably already noticed we are constructing a pergola between Borough Hall and the Library. The new structure will provide an additional area for education and library work. We have to thank our D.P.W. for their efforts in constructing the pergola.

We have plans to increase the eye appeal of the area. It is my hope that we can include sculptures from our residents, in addition to a butterfly/pollinator garden.

Environmental Commission

With fewer outlets available for recycled plastic, the accumulation of plastic waste has become a global crisis. Harrington Park has recognized the problem by passing an ordinance banning single use plastic items in stores, as a first step toward greater sustainability. It will go into effect January 1, 2020. Other towns in Bergen County, such as Paramus and Ridgewood have also instituted such bans. We are hoping other communities in the Northern Valley will enact similar ordinances.

There are many ways you can reduce your dependence on plastic. Start by bringing reusable bags when shopping. Keep them in your car. Bags are available at no cost at Borough Hall. Plastic produce bags can be used more than once but using mesh produce bags, (that last indefinitely) is a better solution. These can be found online and in many supermarkets. There are many alternatives to plastic straws: paper, metal, bamboo, and silicon. Plastic water bottles are a major problem. Carry a reusable water bottle that can be filled.



Our beehives are thriving, and honey produced by the Harrington Park bees can be purchased at Borough Hall.

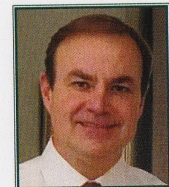

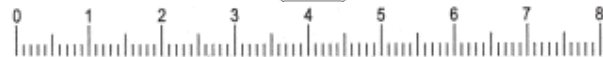

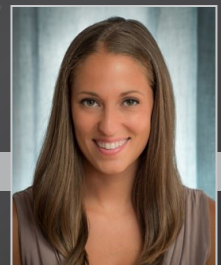
